BIS in Early Childhood Education Studies (34-42)

- a. 19 credits of interdisciplinary courses: EDUC 302; SOCI 303 or GOVT 300;; ECED 402 or 403; ECED 422 or 423; and, six credits of electives relevant to the concentration in consultation with their faculty advisor (24)
- b. Completion of a self-selected minor (15-23)

BIS Individualized Concentration (24-36) (List courses from two or more disciplines)

Students may do an individualized concentration to meet their own academic needs and interests. The concentration is developed in close consultation with BIS staff and a faculty mentor. Students may incorporate into their individualized concentrations up to nine credits of previously earned college course work or previously earned nontraditional credit from other institutions. In addition to the four core courses, students complete between 24 and 36 credits, depending on the topic and the student's preparation. (Students are encouraged to include UNIV 304 - Bachelor Individualized Studies Transfer Transition in the concentration. Students are also encouraged to include BIS 489 - Directed Readings and Research and complete it before taking BIS 490 - Senior Project.)
