A grade of "C-" or better is required in PSYC courses; students must have at least a 2.0 GPA in Psychology course work.

Students may choose to complete a concentration in forensic psychology, human factors and applied cognition, work and organizational psychology, developmental psychology, educational psychology, or health psychology. Courses required for a concentration may simultaneously satisfy other degree requirements. The concentrations in forensic psychology, human factors and applied cognition, and work and organizational psychology meet the applied psychology requirement.

PSYC 372 may be used in place of PSYC 375 only by students who receive PSYC 372 transfer credit from another institution. Students who receive transfer credit for a research methods course must take PSYC 304 or PSYC 309 unless the transfer course has been approved as writing intensive.

Any psychology course may be used to satisfy the 36-credit psychology requirement for the BS degree with the following restrictions: A maximum of 6 credits of 327 and 328 may be applied to required psychology credits; a maximum of 6 credits of 260, 350, and 460 may be applied to required psychology credits; no more than 9 credits of PSYC 327, 328, 260, 350 and 460 can be taken without written permission of the department chair.
