

Advisor Explores New Pathways to Support Students with Trauma

Jill Manuel, an Exploratory Academic Advisor at George Mason University, recently presented at the 2024 NACADA National Conference in Pittsburgh, PA. Her session addressed the critical topic of supporting students with Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). Drawing from personal experience and research, Jill focused on how early trauma impacts students' academic journeys and mental health, emphasizing the role academic advisors play in fostering safe spaces for these students.



The presentation explored the science behind childhood trauma and discussed practical strategies for traumainformed practices in higher education. Jill's goal is to raise awareness about how advisors can meet these students where they are, helping to break cycles of trauma. Reflecting on her motivation, Jill shared that navigating higher education as a first-generation student from an unstable background profoundly shaped her career. She also expressed her excitement about the engagement she receives during these sessions, saying, "It takes a lot for me to get up in front of people, but seeing the interest and conversations that follow makes it worth it." Jill encourages others to pursue opportunities to present, saying, "If you're passionate about a topic, presenting can be a great chance for growth."

Jill's passion for supporting students with Adverse Childhood Experiences extends beyond conference presentations. She developed The Empowerment, Agency & Resiliency Workshop series at Mason, which helps undergraduate students with early life trauma build skills in empowerment, self-advocacy, and resilience. Additionally, Jill has presented on this critical topic at various events, including the Mason Advising Symposium and the College of Education and Human Development Graduate Research Symposium. Her presentations highlight the importance of trauma-informed practices in higher education and continue to spark meaningful conversations among advisors and practitioners.
