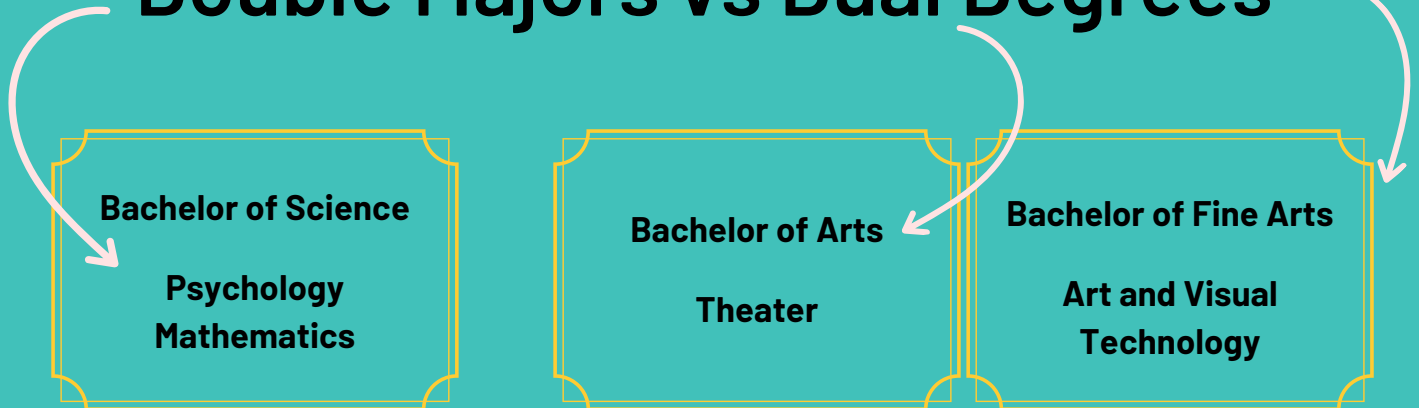


# What are secondary majors, double majors, and dual degrees?

## Primary/Secondary Majors

If you are pursuing more than one major, one will be designated as the primary major and the other will be your secondary major. This does not indicate any hierarchy of importance or affect how you complete your requirements for either major.

## Double Majors vs Dual Degrees



	Double Major	Dual Degree
Number of majors	2	2
Number of degrees	1	2
Minimum number of credits*	120*	150*

- If you double major, your majors must be the same type of degree (e.g. History BA and Biology BA)
- If you earn dual degrees, they can be different types or the same
- For any type of multiple major, each major must have at least 18 unique credits to fulfill major requirements. For example, if a major has 36 major requirements, 18 credits can fulfill requirements for another major or minor, but the other 18 cannot.

\*Minimum credits may vary based on the requirements of the majors/degrees.

## What if I pursue a Bachelor's degree after I graduated with one?

If you have a Bachelor's degree and are pursuing another one, it is not considered a dual degree unless you are planning to earn two more concurrently.

## What about triple majors and multiple minors and concentrations?

For any path you are planning to pursue, discuss your ideas with your academic advisor. They can help you figure out which combination of programs make the most sense for your goals including graduate school, career plans, and when you want to graduate.
