- Physical Education Courses do not count towards credit hours
- Satisfactory grades are required to receive credit for a course
- Students should select Mason Core courses from the approved Provost's list
- Students should meet with their Academic Advisor at least once a semester to plan their semester schedule
- \* Students with a catalog year before Fall 2015 will need to complete a synthesis course instead of a capstone. This means they will take SOCI 377 or SOCI SOCI 483 instead of SOCI 485
- \* Students are strongly encouraged to take both SOCI 485 and SOCI 416 their senior year
